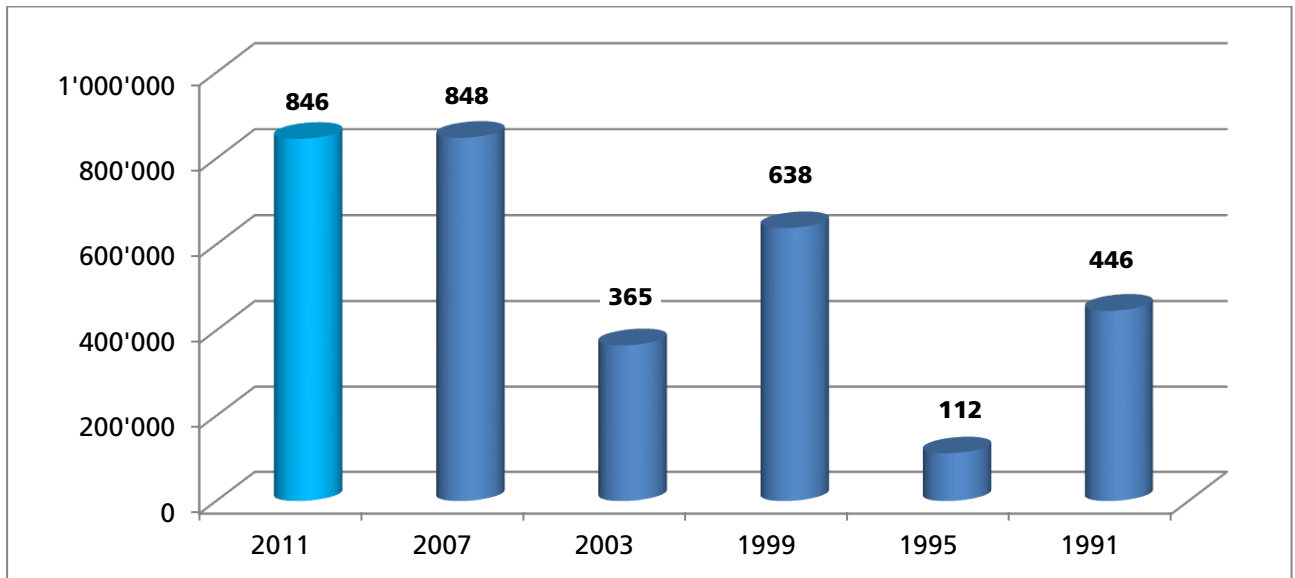

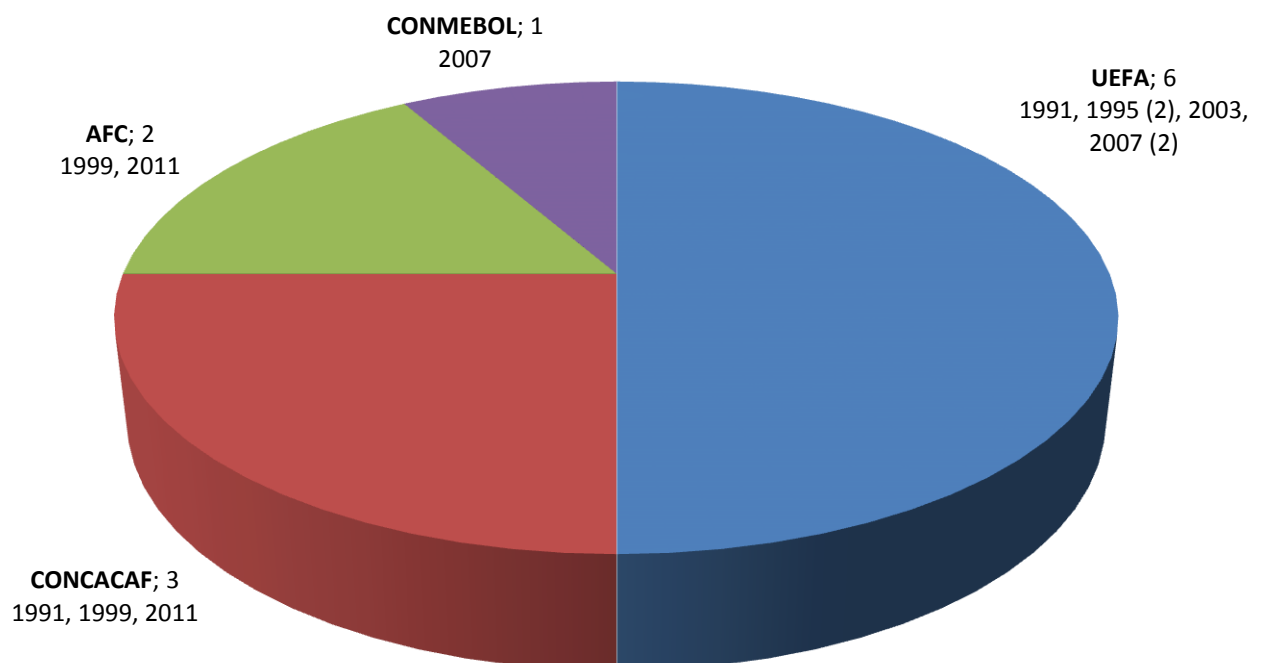

Scoreboard of the Confederations

UEFA has sent six representatives to the FIFA Women's World Cup final: 1991 with Norway (vs USA), in 1995 when Norway faced Germany, in 2003 when Germany met Sweden and in 2007 Germany again when they played Brazil. The USA have reached the final three times (1991 vs Norway, 1999 vs China PR and 2011 vs Japan). USA are also the only host country to have won the competition.



Japan were the first winners of the FIFA Women's World Cup™ to come from the AFC confederation. China also reached the final in 1999 – but lost on penalties to USA.

Japan's Homare Sawa at the age of 32 years and 314 days became the oldest scorer in a FIFA Women's World Cup final match.

Japan worked harder for their success than any other winners of the FIFA Women's World Cup™. In their six games en route to the title, they played two matches that went to extra time, one of which ended in a penalty shoot-out.

It is the first time the winners of FIFA's premier women's competition had lifted the trophy having lost one of their games en route to the Final. Japan were beaten 2-0 by England in a group fixture.

With her five goals, Homare Sawa is the second Asian top goalscorer in FIFA's premier women's competition after Sun Wen's haul of seven for China in 1999.

For the fourth time, the winner of the adidas Golden Shoe came from the trophy-winners. Homare Sawa's total of five goals was the lowest of all the winners of the individual award.

Japan defender Azusa Iwashimizu became the first player to be sent off in the FIFA Women's World Cup™ Final.

Japan's number of goals – 12 - was the lowest total by any of the six world champions. The previous champion's totals were: 25 (USA 1991 and Germany 2003); 23 (Norway 1995); 21 (Germany 2003) and 18 (USA 1999).

Despite not lifting the trophy, USA still lead the way as the most successful team in the history of the competition. With 27 wins in 36 fixtures their win percentage is 75. Germany have 23 wins from 32 games – a win percentage of 71.87.

USA have a seven-goal lead at the head of the FIFA Women's World Cup™ scoring charts. They have 98 from 36 games while Germany have 91 from 32.

Substitutes scored eight goals for USA in the global showpiece. That's one more than the next best team – Germany.

At 36 years and 25 days, USA defender Christie Rampone became the oldest player to appear in a FIFA Women's World Cup™ Final. She beat the record previously set by Kristin Bengtsson who was 33 years and 273 days when she played for Sweden in the 2003 Final against USA.

Abby Wambach's goal in extra time took her tally in the FIFA Women's World Cup™ to 13 – one behind Germany's Birgit Prinz and Marta of Brazil.

USA missed from the spot in the penalty shootout for the first time in the FIFA Women's World Cup™. Their previous two sudden-death deciders – in the 1999 final and against Brazil in this year's quarter-final saw them score five out of five.

Sweden scored in all six games at Germany 2011 and notched the first goal every time. In fact they have scored first in 10 of their last 11 FIFA Women's World Cup™ fixtures – the exception being a 2-0 defeat against USA in a group fixture in 2007.

Sweden's total of 10 goals is the least by the team finishing third in the history of the competition, reflecting the tighter nature of the games at this level. The total for the previous third-placed teams were 12 (USA – 2007), 15 (USA – 2003), 16 (Brazil – 1999), 15 (USA – 1995), 18 (Sweden 1991).

Six Sweden players found the net in Germany 2011, the most since 1991 when seven were on target.

France scored in each of their last eight fixtures at the FIFA Women's World Cup™. Only in their first fixture – a 2-0 defeat against Norway in 2003 – did they failed to score.

The match for third place was referee Kari Seitz' 9th FIFA Women's World Cup fixture in her fourth World Cup. She joined Australia's Tammy Ogston and Canada's Sonia Denoncourt in second place in the all-time rankings, one behind Switzerland's Nicole Petignat who has 10.
